- Free or low-cost exams (clinical breast exams, mammograms and Pap test)
- Confidential screenings with trusted doctors
- Care coordination for abnormal exams
- Breast and cervical cancer treatment may be paid through Medicaid, if qualified

WHAT TO EXPECT



MAMMOGRAM OR CLINICAL BREAST EXAM

- Undress from the waist up.
Tip: Wear a shirt that is easily removable.
- You may experience a feeling of pressure during your mammogram, but it will only last a few seconds.
- Breast exams and mammograms average between 10-15 minutes.



CERVICAL EXAM

- A doctor will use an instrument called a speculum to gather cells from your cervix to test for any abnormal cells.
- If you experience any discomfort or become uncomfortable during an exam, let the health care provider know.



PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS

- Women ages 50 through 64
 - Women at any age with a personal history of breast cancer, or who have completed treatment for invasive cervical cancer may be eligible.
 - Women ages 40-49 with a mother, sister, brother or father diagnosed with breast cancer may also be eligible.
- Uninsured or underinsured
- Not covered by Medicaid or Medicare
- At or below 200% of the federal poverty level
- Primary residence is in Florida
